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



#### 2. Book Reading & Reflection



1. Accessible India Campaign (Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan), 2015



Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) launched the Accessible India Campaign (Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan) as a nationwide Campaign for achieving universal accessibility for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) on December 3, 2015. It has three important verticals, namely - the Build

Environment, the transportation sector and the ICT ecosystem. Under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment

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Accessible India Campaign (Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan) as a nation-wide Campaign for achieving universal accessibility for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs). A new initiative for enhancing accessibility, creating awareness and sensitization for creation a universal barrier free environment was taken by the Central Government

2. Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao, 2015



In 2015, The Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Yojana is a national initiative run jointly by the Ministry of Women & Child Development (MoWCD), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoH&FW), and Ministry of Human Resources Development (MoHRD). Each body is accountable for different aspects of the scheme

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#### 3. RPWD Act, 2016

The RPWD Act, 2016 provides that "the appropriate Government shall ensure that the PWD enjoy the right to equality, life with dignity, and respect for his or her integrity equally with others." The Government is to take steps to utilize the capacity of the PWD by providing an appropriate environment.

Under the Constitution the disabled have been guaranteed the following fundamental rights: The Constitution secures to the citizens including the disabled, a right of justice, liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship, equality of status and of opportunity and for the promotion of fraternity.

1. Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, 2018

1. National Scheme Incentives to Girls for Secondary Education

The *scheme* was launched to promote enrollment of *girl* child in the age group of 14-18 years to encourage *secondary education* among *girls*. The *National Girl* Child *Incentive Scheme* 2019-20 has been started by the Central Government.

1. National Education Policy 2020



The New Education Policy was released under the Government of India's Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) on 30 July 2020. With the motto of Educate Encourage Enlighten, this is the first education policy to be released in the last 34 years in India.



The new education policy 2021 was adopted by the Modi government. The 10 + 2 structure has been fully eliminated in the new education policy. Our country's educational curriculum has been based on 10 + 2, but it will soon be based on 5 + 3 + 3 + 4.

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2. Dalit Bandhu Scheme, 2021. (TS Government)



The Government of Telangana has launched Telangana Dalit Bandhu Scheme. It is basically a welfare scheme for empowering Dalit families. The government is going to provide financial assistance under the TS Dalit Bandhu Scheme started by the state government.
